



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
Challenges Of Access In Balochistan NIPS Population For Age 4-16 Years





Alarming Gap of Gender Equity (Schools)

















POLICY, GOVERNANCE AND LEGISLATIVE REFORMS

- Balochistan Education Sector Plan 2013-18 approved
- Act on Free and Compulsory Education has been promulgated (Rules under process)
- Merit based recruitment through NTS
- Act on Introduction of Mother Language in early grades has been promulgated.
- Chief Minister Education Award Endowment Fund of Rs.500 Million has been created.

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POLICY, GOVERNANCE AND LEGISLATIVE REFORMS

- 57 textbooks developed by private publishers (2007 policy) based on national curriculum 2006 through Balochistan textbook board after 18 amendment.
- Revamping and institutionalization of Education Management Information System (EMIS).
- Replacement of PTC & CT with ADE & B.Ed (Hon's)
- Decentralization and Delegation of Administrative and Financial Powers at Directorate / Division /District / Cluster level.
