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## STATE OF SCHOOL EDUCATION IN BALOCHISTAN

Education is the present Government's No. 1 development priority and this is in recognition of the abject importance of an educated and skilled manpower and the role of education in building a progressive and enlightened society.

The crisis of education is generally viewed as a demand problem, i.e., that communities or parents do not send their children to school. Such cases are prevalent in isolated areas, communities and families. By and large, however, the crisis emanates from the supply side. Children are not in school because of the non-availability of schools, distance of the school, absence of basic school facilities (e.g., toilets and water), lack of security for children, particularly girls, absence of teachers, absence of school supplies and teaching aids, and poor quality of teaching.

An effort has been made to analyze district-wise data on education input variables and correlate them with output variables. Input and output variables include the following:

**Input variables:**

- Enrolment of boys and girls at primary, middle and high school levels
- Number of boys and girls primary, middle and high schools
- No of shelterless, 1-2 rooms and 10-plus rooms schools
- Ratio of teachers per school for boys and girls primary, middle and high schools
- Student-teacher ratio in boys and girls primary, middle and high schools.

Output variables include student performance in ability to read/do calculations in:

- Urdu letters, words, sentences and story
- English letters, words and sentences
- Arithmetic number recognition and 2-digit subtraction and division.

### **ENROLMENT:**

The analysis shows that the education situation in Balochistan is dire, with nearly 60% of children aged 6-16 being out of school<sup>1</sup>. Dera Bugti is the worst district with only 10% of children in school, followed by Lasbela (32%), Bolan (43%) and Musakhel (47%). Quetta and Barkhan are in the most favourable situation, with over 90% of children in school. Districts where 80%-90% of children are in school are Panjgur, Loralai, Pishin, Kech, and Gwadar.

About 85% of attending<sup>2</sup> children are enrolled in government schools. This percentage is over 90% in 15 out of 30 districts: Jafferabad, Kech, Jhal Magsi, Noshki, Panjgur, Barkhan, Gwadar, Lasbela, Nasirabad, Sibi, Musakhel, Kharan, Chagai, Bolan and Qila Saifullah. The lowest attendance in government schools – below 60% – is in Sherani, Quetta and Loralai. Private schools feature only in Quetta, Loralai and Pishin. Overall, 8.5% of attending children attend *madrassahs*. Districts where more than 10% of attending children are enrolled in *madrassahs* are Sherani (40%), Khuzdar (30%), Ziarat (29%), Zhob (26%), Kalat (22%), Loralai and Qilla Abdullah (20%), and Mastung (14%).

## NUMBER OF SCHOOLS:

As of 2011, there are 12,293 schools, of which there are 10,668 primary schools, 961 middle schools and 664 high schools. The highest number of primary schools is in Jafferabad (828), followed by Pishin (752), Loralai (614), Khuzdar (579), Barkhan (571) and Qila Saifullah (543). The lowest numbers of primary schools are in Washuk (138), Harnai (151), Noshki (152), Sherani (162), Kharan (175), and Chagai (194).

The highest number of middle schools is in Pishin (109), followed by Quetta (70), Kech (68), Lasbela (53) and Khuzdar (51). The lowest numbers of middle schools are in Sherani (7), Musakhel (11), Washuk (14), Awaran (17) and Kohlu (19).

The highest number of high schools is in Quetta (75), followed by Kech (45), and Pishin and Jafferabad (34). The lowest numbers of high schools are in Sherani (2), Harnai (9), Washuk (10), Jhal Magsi (11), Chagai (12), and 14 each in Barkhan, Kohlu, Musakhel and Nasirabad.

### **Schools by number of rooms:**

Over one-quarter of schools are shelterless and over half are one or two room schools, with only 5% of schools equipped with 10 or more rooms. The highest percentages of shelterless schools are in Musakhel (46%), Kalat (44%), Dera Bugti (43), Awaran (39%), and Nasirabad (36). The lowest numbers of shelterless schools are in Barkhan (3%), Noshki (6%), Kharan (6), Lasbela (10), and Qila Abdullah (15%). Interestingly, 17% of schools in Quetta are shelterless.

In 19 out of 30 districts, more than half of schools are 1-2 room schools: Barkhan (90%), Kharan (70%), Sherani (68%), Washuk and Lasbela (62%), and Jhal Magsi (61%), Jafferabad (59%), Kohlu (58%), Bolan (57%), Gwadar (56%), Mastung (54%), Panjgur (53%), Khuzdar, Loralai and Sibi (53%), Harnai, Zhob and Chagai (51%), and Nasirabad (50%). The lowest percentage of 1-2 room schools are in Noshki (19%), Quetta (26%), and Kalat (36%).

Districts where the percentage of 10-plus room schools exceeds 10% are Quetta (21%), Noshki (18%), Panjgur and Awaran (10%). In 18 out of 30 districts, the percentage of 10-plus room schools is 5% or less: Kohlu (1%), Sherani (2%), Barkhan, Qila Saifullah and Loralai (2%), Jhal Magsi, Kalat, Khuzdar, Nasirabad, and Pishin (3%), Musakhel, Bolan, Harnai, Jafferabad and Dera Bugti (4%), and Qila Abduallah, Lasbela and Washuk (5%).

### **NUMBER OF TEACHERS PER SCHOOL:**

There are 48,516 teachers, of whom 13,692 (28%) are male primary school teachers, 5,993 (12%) are female primary school teachers, 7,687 (16%) are male middle school teachers, 4,400 (9%) are female middle school teachers, 11,586 (24%) are male high school teachers and 5,158 (11%) are female high school teachers.

The average number of teachers per school for the province as a whole stands at 4, of whom 2.7 and 1.3 are male and female, respectively. There are an average of 1.8 male and 2.1 female per primary school, 12.9 male and 11.7 female teachers per middle school, and 23.7 male and 29.3 female teachers per high school.

The highest ratio of male teachers per primary school is in Quetta (4) and one teacher each in Barkhan, Kharan, Kohlu, Loralai, Musakhel and Sherani. The highest ratio of female teachers per primary school is in Quetta (5) and one teacher each in Barkhan, Kharan, Kohlu, Nasirabad, Sherani and Ziarat.

The highest ratio of male teachers per middle school is in Kalat (21), followed by 18 in Dera Bugti, 16 in Bolan, 15 in Panjgur and Sibi. The lowest numbers of male teachers per middle school is in Gwadar and Musakhel (9). The highest ratio of female teachers per middle school is in Quetta and Jhal Magsi (19), followed by 17 in Kech, and 14 in Bolan, Jafferabad, Panjgur, Qila Saifullah, and Zhob. The lowest numbers of female teachers per middle school is in Harnai (4). There are no female teachers in Sherani.

The highest ratio of male teachers per high school is in Quetta (37), followed by 28 in Sibi and 25 in Bolan and Loralai and less than 20 in Harnai, Kharan and Ziarat (19) and Washuk (17). The highest ratio of female teachers per high school is in Quetta (47), followed by 32-36 teachers in Loralai, Pishin, Kech, Qila Saifullah, and Zhob. The lowest number of female teachers per high school is in Awaran (12). There are no female high school teachers in Sherani.

### **STUDENT-TEACHER RATIO:**

The overall student-teacher ratio in Balochistan is 21, 18 for boys and 26 for girls. The lowest student teacher ratio in primary schools for boys is 12 in Sibi, followed by 17 in Kohlu and Sherani, and 18 in Barkhan, Harnai, Musakhel and Ziarat. The highest ratio is 39 in Qilla Abdullah, followed by 34 in Chagai, and 30 in Noshki.

The lowest student-teacher ratio in primary schools for girls is 18 in Sibi, followed by 21 in Quetta and Barkhan, 22 in Musakhel, and 25 in Harnai, Mastung and Zhob. The highest ratio is 78 in Kharan, 75 in Bolan, 73 in Chagai, and 69 in Washuk, followed by 51-59 Loralai, Sherani, Qila Abdullah and Qila Saifullah, and 40-49 in Awaran, Khuzdar, Noshki, Kalat, Kohlu and Lasbela.

The student-teacher ratio in middle schools for boys is less than 10 in Dera Bugti, Kalat, Barkhan, Kohlu, Qila Saifullah, Sherani, Bolan, Kharan, Washuk, Zhob, and Ziarat. It is the highest in Qila Abdullah (22), followed by 19 in Nasirabad, 18 in Quetta, and 17 in Jafferabad.

The student-teacher ratio in middle schools for girls is less than 10 in Barkhan, Musakhel, and Kohlu. It is the highest in Washuk (34), followed by 28 in Awaran, 27 in Khuzdar, 24 in Kalat and Lasbela and 21 in Zhob. There are no girls middle schools in Sherani

The student-teacher ratio in high schools for boys is less than 10 in Barkhan, Dera Bugti, Musakhel, Kohlu and Sherani. It is the highest in Chagai (25), followed by 20 in Gwadar, Jafferabad and Qila Abdullah and 21 in Quetta.

There are no girls high schools where the student-teacher ratio is less than 10. The student-teacher ratio is 10 to 20 in Dera Bugti, Jhal Magsi, Kohlu, Musakhel, Pishin, Noshki, Sibi, Washuk, Ziarat, Barkhan, Loralai, Mastung, Qila Saifullah, Bolan, Kalat and Quetta. It is as high as 34 in Awaran, 33 in Gwadar and 32 in Nasirabad. There are no girls high schools in Sherani.

### **STUDENT PERFORMANCE:**

The crisis of education can be discerned from the fact that only 60% of school age going children (6-16) are in formal schooling and 36% of them have never enrolled or have dropped out of school. The problems with education can be attributed to supply variables, i.e., shortage of schools and teachers, as discerned by the data relating to numbers of schools, numbers of 10-plus rooms schools, teachers per school, and student-teacher ratio. The situation varies, however, district by district. It can be expected that student performance is better where the supply situation is relatively better. This, unfortunately, is not the case.

Overall, learning levels are extremely low. Sample test results for Class V students shows that, in Urdu, 2% can read nothing, 6% can read only alphabets, 19% can read only words, 28% can read only sentences and less than half can read a story. In English, 11% can read nothing, 16% can read only alphabets, 39% can read only words and 24% can read a story. In arithmetic, 2% can do nothing, 16% can recognize only numbers, and 37% can do 2-digit subtraction and division.

Class X student performance appears to be mixed. While over 70% of students can read a story in Urdu and sentences in English, 43% can carry out 2-digit subtraction and division. This can be attributed to the possibility that some of the students who go beyond primary level (a minority) do receive *relatively* better quality education. However, the balance have performed worse.

Barkhan is a case in point. The district has the highest enrolment rate (94.9%) and ranks high on the numbers of boys and girls schools; yet student performance scores are poor: 67% of Class V and 88% of Class X student cannot read a story in Urdu, 70% of Class V students and 88% of Class X students cannot read a sentence in English, and 64% of Class V and 86% of Class X students cannot carry out 2-digit divisions.

A modest statistical effort highlights the situation further. The data for all the variables have been converted into indices, so as to standardize them. Input variables have been categorized into two: one where a high score is to be viewed positively and the other where a high score is to be viewed as adverse and have negative signs. An example of the former is enrolment rates and of the latter is shelterless schools. The sum of all input variables and the sum of all output variables has been correlated and the correlation coefficient is estimated at 0.2618; thereby, highlighting the weak relationship between the two.

## **CONCLUSIONS AND OPTIONS:**

Three preliminary conclusions emerge from the foregoing analysis.

- One, the education infrastructure in terms of numbers of schools and teachers is seriously lacking in almost all districts.
- Two, in districts where input variables (enrolment and numbers of schools and teachers) score high, student performance is not necessarily better.
- Three, student performance is relatively, but significantly, better for Class X students than for Class V students.

The conclusions indicate that multi-room, multi-teacher schools fare better than one-room-one-teacher schools and strengthens the case for an ‘enclave approach’ with school campuses offering teaching from Class I to X and specialist subject teachers and equipped with library, science and computer laboratory, and sports and extra-curricular activities. Children do not learn from books alone, but also from physical exercise, sports, music, quiz and debating competitions and playing together. One-two room schools do not provide the intellectual environment that school campuses do.

The above will fulfill the necessary conditions for improvement of education, but will not be sufficient for improvement of the quality of education. The latter involves reform of the curriculum, teacher training and employment terms and incentive structure for teachers.

### ***Strengthening the one room-one teacher schools:***

While the analysis shows that one-room-one-teacher type of schools do not contribute to quality teaching, these schools cannot be done away with. Balochistan is a vast territory with a sparse and scattered population. It cannot be expected that children under the age of 10 can commute 10-20 kilometers to attend what has been described earlier as school enclaves. Efforts then will have to centre on measures to improve the quality of teaching in these schools.

A proposed option is to make use of ICT and offer teaching programs via distance learning techniques. Each school will need to be equipped with audio-visual equipment (TV set, etc.) and generator and a UPS system. Programs can be tailored for specific requirements and offered in all regional languages of the province. Teachers will need to be trained in inter-facing with the distance learning techniques.
